VERSE: 7 Zayin

Remember [always] the word *and* promise to Your servant, In which You have made me hope.

50 This is my comfort in my affliction, That Your word has revived me $an\partial$ given me life.

51 The arrogant utterly ridicule me, Yet I do not turn away from Your law.

52 I have remembered [carefully] Your ancient ordinances, O Lord, And I have taken comfort.

53 Burning indignation has seized me because of the wicked, Who [b]reject Your law.

54 Your statutes are my songs In the house of my pilgrimage.

55 O Lord, I remember Your name in the night, And keep Your law.

56 This has become mine [as the gift of Your grace], That I observe Your precepts [accepting them with loving obedience].



The Sword of the Spirit 'the Word of God'

INSIGHTS

At the introduction of this verse (Zayin), the Poet appeals to God to remember His Word and promises which is his hope in affliction, bringing comfort in despair and his encouragement. From his petitions, life is full of uncertainties and unprecedented spiritual attacks thereby, 'lamenting' about his low times. Nonetheless, he draws his strength and protection from God's Word. For he mentions it in every line. He has devotedly relied on it despite his hopelessness, misery, being mocked, annoyed, and restless. Why? It is his <u>Armor of defence</u>, and <u>a weapon against (offense)</u> spiritual attack [Ephesians 6:11-17, Matthew 4]

As we continue, one thing for sure is that the Poet is **anchored** in God's Word despite the enemy ways of creating anxiety and moments of brokenness in him. Thus, he states.*..I have remembered [carefully] Your ancient ordinances*... He is portraying a picture of one's eternal identity rooted in the Word.

Lastly, he asserts ...O *Lord, I remember Your name in the night...* This has been his practice, his way of life. Meditate on the night; the temporary and momentary darkness; yet he comes back again and again to **recall "Who is God to you?"**. The Poet is figurative sense of **ruminating and reflecting** over the revelation that comes with the central personality and nature of the One who bears the name [Psalm 148:13].

The Poet has shown us that God's Word is a transformational tool and weapon, <u>our Sword</u>. It brings hope, comfort, strength, and protection when you need it most. It's alive and powerful; active and personal. The more you possess it the more ready you will be for spiritual battle. The Bible is your only defence and offensive weapon in pathway to life. And Jesus demonstrated this when He was tempted in the wilderness by the devil.
