THEME

INSIGHTS

Anchored in the eternal, unchanging, and infinite Word of God, the Poet begins by expressing deep sentiments for God's Word... "I love Your law." His love for the Word has drawn him into a close intimacy with God. Consequently, he reflects and contemplates on it all through the day. Like him, our hearts tend to gravitate to what we truly love [Psalm 119:11], for it is written for where your treasure is, there your heart [your wishes, your desires; that on which your life centers] will be also [Matthew 6:21]. And because he ponders on it daily, the Poets acknowledges that the Word of God dispenses in him the Wisdom from God [James 1:5-8]. Which makes him wiser than his enemies. He can also attest to deeper insights because of God's Word, with more understanding than those who instruct him and those who are ahead of him in life. Therefore, with Wisdom comes self-discipline/self-control to the sinful nature in check (holiness) and from walking in wrong paths.

The Poet is experiencing the great results to obeying God's Word because of the understanding and Wisdom that God Himself has trained him.

Lastly, the Poet gives us the impression that he is evidently delighted in God's Word and derives genuine pleasure from it [1 Samuel 14:27]. Nonetheless, employing God's Word the Poet can now discern right ways from false ways, and to shun the false ones [Proverbs 14:12].

We observe how the Poet's love for the Word has made him <u>walk the way of life securely</u>. Indeed, the Word of God is valuable; true Wisdom, Knowledge and Understanding on how to do live life well comes from it.
