Life Through the Spirit

-Romans 8

THEME

INSIGHTS

Here (Gimel) the Poet begins by pleading with God to richly deal with him so that he may be able live and Keep His Word. To him, abundant life means believing and obeying God's Word. In other words, God's Word is Life [John 6:63]. Next, he requests for his eyes to be opened so that he may "see" the wondrous things of God's Law. Now, what the poet is requesting from God is 'the gift of sight' beyond the physical... He wants to <u>PERCEIVE</u> THE SPIRITUAL TRUTH, which is a supernatural illumination and revelation. To perceive the Word of God goes beyond just knowledge (information/facts), it is with understanding (compression/insight) and Wisdom (how to apply it/judgement) [Ephesians 1:15-23]. Hence, it can ONLY be perceived through the eyes of the Holy Spirit [1 Corinthians 2:13-15].

The poet also acknowledges that He is "a stranger on the earth". Likewise, are the Children of God who are Kingdom ambassadors in this World [1 peter 1-2]. We are from a different and greater Kingdom [Philippians 3:20]. Therefore, he prays, "Hide not your commandments from me." This is his plea having recognized that God's Word is his guide/road map [Psalms 119:105].

He also expresses His deep passion for God's Word "at all times" this is an expression of thirst for God, an indication of pursuit after God's heart [Psalm 42, John 14:31].

Lastly the poet is confident in God's dealings with those he describes as "the cursed *ones*" and that God will hear his prayers for relief from persecution, remove ridicule, reproach and the taunts. For he keeps His testimonies, meditates on His statues and delights in His counsel [John 14:27, 15:18-21, 16:33, 2 Timothy 3:12].

Like the poet, through Jesus Christ who is our model let us His faithful followers alter our perspective adopting a meek posture spiritually. Which brings us in walk with the Holy Spirit and into alignment with the Will of the Father.
