THEME

INSIGHTS

We have already previously observed how the Poet is dependent on God's Word; it is valuable to him for he draws comfort, strength, hope, direction and sustenance (life) from it. Consequently, it does not come by surprise when he starts this Stanza (Pe-mouth, speak, and open) by confessing that God's Word is 'Wonderful' and that is why his "soul stores them". This means that he internalizes God's Word which we saw from Aym's insight rendering him a steward of God's Word; he is a witness of it [Colossians 3:16]. Now, he says that when God's Word be it Unwritten or Written causes enlightenment (spiritual awakening) in our lives [Ephesians 1:18, Proverbs 9:10-11; 6:23, Psalm 119:105]. As a result, the Poet (with the help of Holy Spirit) can come to a right and simple interpretation.

The strange land (the world) is spiritually dry (wilderness hence the Poet thirsts for God's Word; it is quenching (satisfying) [Psalm 42:1-2, John 4:14; 6:53-58; 7:37-39]. We see an emphasis from him, at every opportunity constantly pleading for God's benevolence, love, and mercy [2 Corinthians 12:7-10].

He seeks direction for his life from God's Word, he has a destination to reach, and God's Word is the road map, helping him to navigate through life. [Galatians 5:7]. He then pleads for spiritual empowerment from the Oppression of Sin; he seeks deliverance (freedom) [John 8:31-36, Ephesians 3:16-19; 6:10]. Along with, deliverance (freedom) from oppression of Man. He wants to comply with God's Word, he does not want to be lukewarm [Revelation 3:14-22].

Subsequently, he makes a prayer of blessing echoed from the Torah in Numbers 6:24 – 26. he desires reassurance and blessings from God [Psalm 67:1]. Even so, He is still willing to be taught more of God's Word.

He concludes with a heavy statement; his heart is sensitive towards God's Word. He is deeply distressed by those who have rebelled against God's Word. Compassion rules his heart, he knows the wrath of God awaits the rebellious [Luke 19:41-44, Romans 6:23].
